

# Westwood Hills A.H. - Canine Lifetime Wellness Schedule

Please remember that this is a wellness schedule. If your pet becomes ill, additional diagnostics will be necessary.

- Pets don't age the way people do- they age much faster. Most pets are considered seniors at 8 years of age. These pets should visit the vet more frequently
- We recommend year round – monthly heartworm & flea/tick prevention.
- ❖ *Up to 85% of pets older than 3 years have dental disease! Dogs and cats aren't supposed to have bad breath. They have bad breath because they don't brush their teeth. Advanced dental disease can be painful, not to mention costly. If you are unable to brush your pet's teeth daily consider having a dental cleaning performed once a year.*

## 8 weeks

- Physical exam
- Weight
- Distemper vaccine
- Bordetella (Kennel cough) Vaccine
- Intestinal Parasite screening
- Dewormer

## 12 weeks

- Physical exam
- Weight
- (1/2) Distemper + Leptospirosis vaccine
- Intestinal Parasite screening
- Dewormer (if needed)

## 16 weeks

- Physical exam
- Weight
- Rabies vaccine
- (2/2) Distemper vaccine + Leptospirosis

- Intestinal Parasite screening
- Dewormer (if needed)

## 4-6 Months

- Pre-surgical blood work (recommended)
- Spay/ Neuter surgery
- Microchip (recommended)

## 1-7 Years

- Physical exam
- Weight
- Yearly Heartworm/tick-borne disease test
- Intestinal Parasite screening
- Rabies vaccine (every three years)
- Annual Distemper + Lepto vaccine
- Annual Bordetella
- Junior Wellness blood work
- Dental cleaning

## 8-20 Years

- Physical Exam
- Weight
- Intestinal Parasite screening
- Rabies vaccine (every three years)
- Annual Distemper + Lepto
- Annual Bordetella vaccine
- Dental cleaning
- Senior Wellness blood work + Urinalysis and Thyroid testing

## Senior Wellness

### Tests/Diagnostics

- ❖ Comprehensive blood test (Chemistry)
- ❖ Complete blood count (CBC)
- ❖ Urinalysis
- ❖ Thyroid testing
- ❖ Radiography
- ❖ Blood pressure
